

Dada Chance Collage

Be inspired by the Dadaists! Cut, stick and create a unique artwork using collage and photomontage.

Dada who?

The word 'Dada' was a nonsense (made up) word used to describe an artistic and literary movement that started during the World War 1. They were a movement of artists that used chance to create new work using found objects, print and text.

What do you need?

All you need is scissors, glue and a surface to use as a base, such as paper or card. You can make your collage from old newspapers, magazines, flyers and add your favourite colours if you like.

Top Tip: Move your cut outs around the background and think about where you want place your cut outs before you stick them down. You could also place your cut outs in a bag or hat, then pull them out and lay them in the order they appear, if you want to be a bit of a 'Dadaist'.
